

Using Screen Capture & Live Presenter (Tutorial A6)

You can use the Screen Capture tool to save static screens from individual handhelds, as well as present any student

screen in real time. You can even record and save movies of the screen captures. To use the Screen Capture tool,

first make sure that you have a current class session running, and your students are logged in via their handhelds or

computers for Navigator NC. Next, click on the Take Screen Capture icon in the toolbar, and choose Capture Class. A

Select Individual(s) dialog box appears allowing you to determine which students' screens you want to capture, and

then click OK. Here, we can see what's on the students' screens. If somebody changes something on the screen, I

can click the Auto-Refresh menu in the upper right corner, and set an Auto-Refresh time using the options in the list.

The default is for the screens to be anonymous, but you can click on the checkbox to show student names. If you

want the screens larger, you can either use the Zoom tools in the toolbar, or change the view by clicking on the View

menu, and choose Gallery. Now, if I had multiple screens, I'd see them along the left, and I could click on each

thumbnail and see a much larger view of each screen. You can also select a student handheld and make that student

a presenter. To do this, click on the student's screen, and then click Make Presenter in the toolbar. This will

open a presenter view. The student can now perform actions as normal on their handheld. You can see the key presses

highlighted in the emulator to the left, as well as a history of the key presses, reading left-to-right and top-to-bottom,

below the large screen display. You can hide these features by unchecking the boxes under the screen display. You can

also record a movie of the handheld's actions. To do this, click the Start Recording button below the screen display,

and perform any actions as normal. When complete, click Stop Recording. This will bring up a dialog box prompting

you to save your movie. I'll give my movie a unique name, and then click Save. When you're done using the Live Presenter,

click Stop Presenter, and you'll be sent back to the Screen Capture window. To close it and return to the main TI-Nspire

Navigator console, close the window by clicking the red X in the upper right corner.
